


Since FY13, passengers increased at a CAGR of 7.0% and the number of

Underlying profit has grown at an average rate of 12.7% driven by greater passengers and operational efficiencies





Regulatory environment update

The regulatory regime

- A dual-till information disclosure regime
- Includes monitoring of service standards, asset availability, capital expenditure plans, efficiency of pricing and return on investment
- Commerce Commission monitors regime effectiveness, they do not set prices
- Commerce Act regime has been in place for 9 years

Outcomes for the current pricing period

 New tariffs set that result in an average annual change in real revenue per PAX



- Domestic 0.8%
- Introduction of a runway land charge, and new domestic regional and passenger charges
- Consulted on \$1.9bn capital expenditure in 2017 dollars on aeronautical infrastructure over the next five years

Next steps

- Capital programme underway to deliver benefits for customers
- Commerce Commission section 53B review in progress – draft report will be published in March 2018
